# Factsheet for N- and O-Level students



The 2021 ITE Early Admissions Exercise will include admissions

into the eight Higher Nitec courses that will be offered on a three—year pathway under the enhanced ITE curricular structure.

important point

ITE Early Admissions Exercise (ITE EAE) is an **aptitude-based admissions** exercise that allows you to apply and receive a conditional offer for admission to ITE, based on your **aptitude and interest**, before taking your GCE N- or O-Level exams.

If you choose not to apply to ITE through ITE EAE, you may still do so through other admissions exercises, such as the Joint Intake Exercise (JIE) or Joint Admissions Exercise (JAE).

2 criteria

### ITE EAE is open to:

- Students who are Singapore Citizens / Singapore Permanent Residents and registered to sit for GCE N- or O-Levels in 2021;
- International Students currently in Government, Government-aided or Independent Schools who are registered to sit for GCE N- or O-Levels in 2021; and
- Singapore Citizens / Singapore Permanent Residents who have taken the GCE N- or O-Level examinations previously.

Your conditional offer will be automatically confirmed if you meet subject-specific Minimum Entry Requirements (MERs) for the course. If your ITE EAE offer is confirmed after the release of the 2021 GCE results, you <u>will not</u> be eligible to participate in the upcoming JIE or JAE.
